

Northeast Ohio's newest mountain bike trail is now open in Geauga Park District's Big Creek Park – and it's one that'll be fun for experienced mountain bikers and first-timers alike!

Geauga County's first single-track mountain bike trail was added to this park in September 2020 thanks to a partnership with the Cleveland Area Mountain Bike Association (CAMBA), which developed and laid out the trail with the help of the Park District's in-house construction crew.

The trail itself is 2.05 miles, with hikers sharing the space for just over a half a mile. Direction of travel changes daily to foster even wear of the trail; riders must consult signage for guidance when they arrive. The trail map published at www.geaugaparkdistrict.org/park/big-creek-park leads riders to the marked entrance of the mountain bike trail and shows them the lay of the land.

CAMBA Treasurer Mike Ryba said his team surveyed the land multiple times, identifying points that were the most attractive and those that needed to be avoided.

"Then you are trying to 'connect the dots' while avoiding wet and flat areas," he said. "Natural surface trails are sensitive to compaction and erosion, so we try to stay high and dry, all the while creating a trail that's fun to ride at both slow and faster speeds in either direction."

That's a lot of variables to consider, he acknowledged, but he said it was a pleasure to work with Park District staff – even on the hottest days of the summer.

"Big Creek's new trail would be considered a 'traditional' trail with some modern touches," Ryba said, "meaning there is minimal disruption of the natural resources, so the rider gets to see the best Nature can offer. Difficulty-wise, it would be considered on the easy side of intermediate."

"We're really excited to work in cooperation with CAMBA, and really appreciated all the time and expertise they volunteered," said Director of Planning & Operations Matt McCue said. "They did a great job with some of their members helping."

According to Ryba, total hours put in by CAMBA volunteers to date are as follows: 85 hours for 2020, 159 hours for 2021 as of 4/28/21.



Geauga County now has a destination for mountain bikers that its residents can be proud of, one that will continue to grow to accommodate enthusiasts of varying skill levels, including beginners. Comments left on Facebook indicate it has gotten substantial use for a new trail, with many more eager to explore it this year once the wet spring weather subsides. A post introducing the trail in September 2020 received 137 likes, 22 comments and an impressive 38 shares.
